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This letter of articulation defines the terms of understanding between Ramapo College of New Jersey (RCNJ) and BCC Bergen Community College regarding a non-credit course that the achievement of a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from RCNJ by students that complete the BCC Associates Degree in Nursing.

AGREEMENT made and entered into on 9/28/11 by and between Ramapo College of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as RCNJ and Bergen Community College, hereinafter referred to as BCC.

WHEREAS, RCNJ is a baccalaureate and master's degree granting college dedicated to the provision of instruction in the humanities, the natural, behavioral and social sciences, business education and social work, and health professions;

WHEREAS, BCC is an associate's degree granting college that provides a comprehensive set of affordable, accessible, high quality, full and part-time courses as well as several degree and on-degree programs;

WHEREAS, RCNJ and BCC wish to conduct strong educational programs grounded in the strengths of both institutions without needless duplication of resources;

NOW THEREFORE, RCNJ and BCC wish to enter into an articulation program of education leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

I. General Description of the Program

- A. **Design of the Program** - RCNJ recognizes a dual credit pathway for students who have earned the associate's degree in nursing from BCC and wish to complete the BSN program through a program of study that includes courses completed at RCNJ. The program will allow transfer of up to 90 credits from BCC and to identify that an BSN graduate who has completed the BCC nursing program and completed course work at RCNJ is eligible to receive credit for the first two semesters of the BSN program. Students who complete the AACN standards for the BSN program and wish to participate in this articulation agreement and earn up to 90 transfer credits, must satisfy the identified courses through prior transfer credit from an accredited institution or BCC prior to the admission of a BSN program at RCNJ.

B. **Routes of Entry** - BCC students who meet the admission requirements will need to apply through the BCC Admissions Office. All students must meet the standards outlined in the outlined plan with minimum financial aid eligibility and maintain satisfactory academic progress.

C. **The Program** - The short-term nursing program is a 16-credit program that leads to an AAS degree and additional credits. The program is completed in two semesters for a total of 32 credits. The program is designed to meet the needs of the BCC community.
