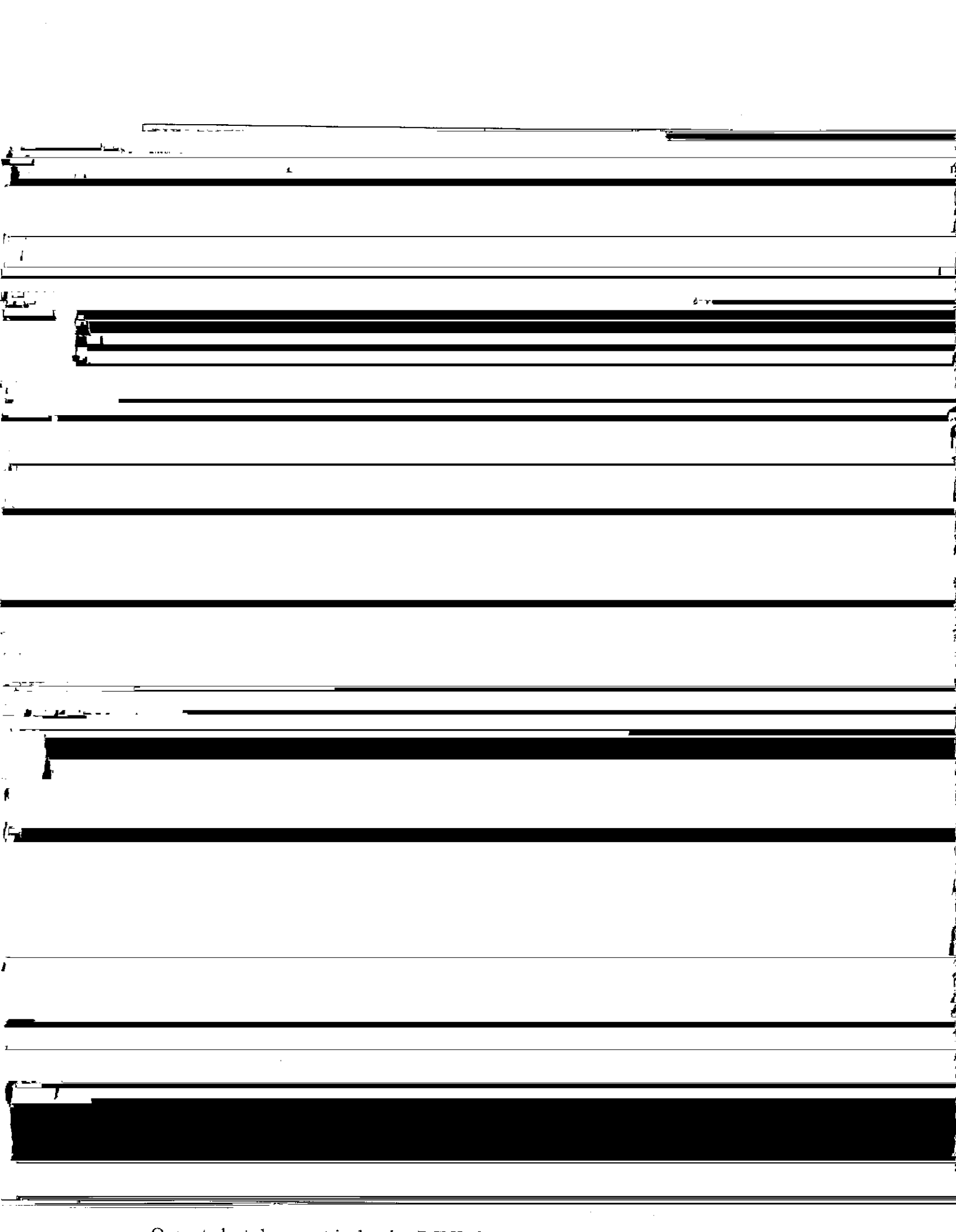

AGREEMENT made and entered into on June 13, 2012 by and between Ramapo College of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as RCNJ, and Warren County Community College, hereinafter referred to as WCCC

Whereas, RCNJ is a baccalaureate and master's degree-granting college dedicated to the provision of instruction in the humanities; the natural, behavioral and social sciences; business, education and social work; and health professions;
And

B. **Routes of Entry** WCCC students who meet the established Admissions criteria will need to apply through the RCNJ Admissions Office once they complete their associate's degree. All students must meet the standard transfer admissions requirements. **As a result of this agreement, WCCC students who apply to RCNJ's Literature program via paper application will have their \$60 application fee waived.**

C. **The Program**- Warren County Community College students interested in transferring to Ramapo College of New Jersey to major in literature with a concentration in creative writing should complete all the requirements of either the Associate in Fine Arts in Creative Writing or the Associate in Arts in Liberal Arts (English option). RCNJ will transfer a maximum of 64 community college credits. Students who complete the Associate in Arts will receive 12
